In this fourth year of UKirk's ministry and presence at SMU, we deepened our roots, explored new possibilities, and continued to create a place where all belong. As a worshiping community, we explored the theme "Grounded & Growing," diving into scriptures that remind us that God is the ground of our being and the source of our growth.

Like a student moving through college, this ministry has matured over the last four years and we've learned so much along the way. We are proud to be fully grounded on SMU's campus, and we are proud that our larger community recognizes that our work of radically inclusive ministry is invaluable. Simultaneously, we continue to grow in beautiful and sometimes unexpected ways. Our budget, our student population, our alumni, and our impact are all expanding, and we rejoice in these signs of growth. At the same time, we continue to cherish the intimate gatherings of small groups of students and seek to preserve the deep connectivity that makes UKirk special. We are grounded in our identity and we are growing as a place that serves all students.

Last fall, we underwent a feasibility study to determine the level of support for a Capital Campaign. Ever the dreamers, our Board of Directors wondered if this might be the time to find UKirk SMU a more permanent physical space on campus, and so we endeavored on a journey of listening and learning. It was a gift to hear your hopes and dreams and to envision the future together! We heard just

how much this ministry means to students, families, alums, and congregations. And we heard that you all want us to continue both broadening and deepening our relationships. While we aren't yet ready to pursue a permanent space, we have recognized that our community extends far beyond the Boulevard and Canterbury House.

And so we have committed to grounding ourselves in relationships, finding home in the continued expansion and growth of our community. We feel excited about where we are and grateful to be in an ecumenical partnership that offers us a physical space to host our growing organization. We remain dedicated to continuing our work of sustainable growth so that generations of students to come will find a home in UKirk SMU. It was a joy to come together for our first fundraising Gala in June to celebrate this ministry with all of you.

God continues to ground us here and now, even as we grow toward a bright future. We give deep thanks for your partnership, your financial gifts, your prayers, and your care. Together, we are creating a place for all to belong.

Programmatic highlights

We welcomed 80 students this year into our community, offering a fully inclusive and affirming place for all to call home.

We offered care and meaning-making in 250+ coffees and pastoral care conversations.

We retreated with 20 students to Mo-Ranch for rest, play, and relaxation over Labor Day weekend in partnership with First Presbyterian Church, Fort Worth. We especially enjoyed stargazing and swimming in the river.

We gathered for 22 Sunday worship and dinners,

creating a weekly landing place for weary students to breathe, laugh, eat, and dwell in God's presence. We're so grateful for the 100+dinner providers who fed our students with nourishing and delicious food!

We **empowered 11 student leaders** to envision, plan, and build the UKirk SMU program.

We **raised over \$41,000** on North Texas Giving Day from 76 donors and celebrated your incredible generosity!

Programmatic highlights, cont.

We **learned together** through our studies of the Gospel of Mark and women in the Bible, and our Advent and Lenten devotionals. We boulevarded (tailgated) on Bishop Boulevard for Homecoming and Parents Weekend, sharing school spirit with students, families, supporters, and alums.

We **feasted together** for our Fall Fundraising Breakfast at Northridge Presbyterian Church, sharing gratitude for the support of our community and listening to our students share about the impact of this ministry.

We journeyed through a Feasibility Study with Vandersall Collective, hearing from 58 households about your hopes and dreams for the future of UKirk SMU. We listened to sermons from 5 student preachers who shared their stories of groundedness and growing and inspired us with their wisdom.

We made a pilgrimage with 9 students to Montreat College Conference, beginning 2023 in the mountains with hundreds of new friends and delighting in the connectional church.

Programmatic highlights, cont.

We supported the gifts and artistry of our students by bringing our UKirk SMU cheering squad to 25 student events including dance performances, theater productions, research presentations, special interest gatherings, and Pride Visibility Day!

We celebrated with 19 graduates, sending them into the world with lots of love and a few tears.

We enjoyed God's creation and local Dallas sites with fellowship events to Oak Point Nature Preserve, Trinity River Audubon Center, and a Dallas Stars Game.

We engaged in interfaith fellowship by hosting our third annual Ramadan Dinner, collaborating with the SMU Office of the Chaplain and Religious Life and the Muslim Student Association to foster deeper connections across faith traditions.

We rested with 8 students at Sister Grove Farm during Lent, orienting ourselves toward Holy Week by reconnecting to God's creation and the sacred rhythms of life and death. We loved welcoming two baby lambs into the world on Palm Sunday.

We hosted the Homecoming of Your Dreams, our first ever fundraising gāla in June and raised over \$46,000! We danced, posed for the photo booth, enjoyed good food and great company, and partied hard!
